My comments are:

- 1. You should supply a patrol map.
- 2. Why was it necessary to use Mr. Brillante when it is a Ningerum patrol?
- You should indicate clearly the date of submission of the report. You show 9/73 whereas your covering memorandum is dated 8/10/73. The patrol was completed on the 13/9/73.
- 4. Mr. Brillante should sign his report.
- 5. It is not clear whether Mr. Brillante has determined ownership of the two areas of land in the OK MENGA Gorge area but I presume the land ownership report will make this clear. You do appreciate if the land is in dispute the matter has to be brought up for settlement by the Land Titles Commission.
- 6. I would expect the medical matter at loast to be covered by a Situation Report. In any case you now have to write separate letters on the subject to PHD Dara explaining what is happening patrol reports are not action documents and it is not enough to say "It is now up to PHD to come good".
- 7. Mr. Brillante should be supplied with a dictionary.
- 8. What was the result of the shotgun incident. Did you hold any sort of enquiry?

MINGERUM PATPOL REPORT NG. 1 73/74. - STAR MOUNTAINS C.D.

... Hererith my completed report in regards to the above mentioned patrol. Although the patrol commenced at Olsobip and a number of villages were visited from within that noministrative arm, the fact that the main aim of the patrol was to visit a village within the Mingerum administrative area gives it percence.

The names of the owners of land in the Ok Munga gorgo was obtained without any difficulty. An investigation report with genealogy will submitted later. No survey was done as it is only to determine ownership for occupancy fee.

The people appeared to appreciate the medical treatment at village level. Political education and general administration was an integral part of the patrol. A shooting incident resulting in the death of a Telefomin man was investigated at Tabubil.

Included with the report are; patrol report covers, field officer's journal for the period, patrol instructions and camping claim.

Introduction.

this patrol visited villages of the Fairol consus division, classing and of the Stor Mountains, Ningerum. The main aim of the patrol was to determine ownership of an erea of land currently being used by Kenneestt pacific for neteorological purposes. The necessity proper when the Migalschip pecule asked if they were to be paid or upation fees for the use of their land. They are the only village group in the Star Mountains census division who have refused to join the council. They had else become a bitter blaming the government for the Kenneestt stop.

- conducted in every village visited. A medical assistant accompanied the patrol or P.H.D. Hingerum. No major illnesses were encountered with rost meeding only external treatment for sores.
- The patrol a seared most welcomed at Migaleiship and I was unable to gauge any il feelings or tension. It would also appear that most of the inter-village str fe has also been recolved.

Villagos.

- the villages visited in both the Cloobic and Hingerum area could do with improvement and the tracks in many spots appear to have been a glocted for some considerable time. Follows was described when we arrived, with every sign of it to be shortly abandoned. New rest houses here been constructed in a shortly abandoned. New rest houses here been constructed in a shortly riles from the normal inter-village track. The Bolongon valley, wiles from the normal inter-village track. The Bolongon people were the only group act encountered slong the route. One family people were the only group act encountered slong the route. One family from the group appeared in the porning prior to our departure from the village.
- The Migalsimbip people are presently engaged with the clearing of ground to a gravel base floor and the construction of a new village. They seem to have taken the example from Kennecott.
- 6. The Wangbie village site beside Lake Wangbin has now



been permanently abandoned. None of the houses are being used. A new village gite has been established about three miles from Tabubil on a ridge some five hundred feet above the platem of Tabubil. The new site has been named Bolongabip.

7. A brail group of people from Bultem have definately split from the main village group, due mainly to a conflict of personalities. This group have moved to the other side of the Alico river below Tabubil. They have constructed a village near the Mingerum village of Manikits, which they have named Bultem #2. A kunda suspension bride gives direct access between their village site and their traditional land.

Reception of Patrol.

8. In all the villages visited, with the exception of Polongen, reception and attendance was excellent. The people appeared very keen to talk and discuss issues and problems. They were very interested in knowing more about Salf Government and independence. The Migalsimbip people co-operated fully and the information required was obtained without any difficulty.

Local Covernment.

9. The Star Mountains consus division has now been included in the Ningerum Local Government Gouncil. All but the Migalsimbip people have been incorporated. I was told that it was the elders who were most opposed to the council. They are happy with the present system and do not went life couplicated by new laws, taxes (which according to them would be impossible to pay) and new restrictions.

10. While at Manikits the villagers complained that they feel they have been neglected since the establishment of the Ningerum council. The ex village constable states that the people are reverting not progressing. He claimed that as a result the people are living more in the bush with the villages and tracks deteriorating. I was asked why the village constable system had been foreaken and why they had been abandened.

11.

Fouce of Assembly - Membervaille at Tabubil I was asked by valingers from Bultem, why their member of the House of Assembly had not visited them. I explained that the duties of a member were diverse, and it was not merely to attend meetings in Moresby them to return and report. It was explained that he had committements to the country as a whole, not just their electorate. I explained the difficulties of transport and communications, and the various pressures and hardships being faced by all members.

Political Education.

12. Political education was given in the form of discussions during the day with assembled villagers and also at night with the men, in the men's houses. A flip chart was us d as well, which dealt mainly with health and hygiene. It would appear that the people are extremely interested and willing to learn.

Economy.

is all of the people of the Star Mountains and Olsobip area generally are basing their entire economic futtre on Kennesott. It would seem that they might to correct. Kennesott themselves are not certain whether the site is worth mining. At least another period of intensive drilling is required before they can convince themselves. Negotiations for a firm agreement are presently in session.

Healsh.

×.

14. A medical essistant accompanied this patrol thanks to P.H.D. Hingorum. Health in the area appeared reasonable although skin seres and ulcers were very common. There were complaints from every village in the Star Meuntain groups visited, that the medical essistant employed by Kennesott refused to give them any aid or attention.

15. The situation is touchy at the moment. The medical assistant at Tabubil is an employee of Kennecott, the aid post is a Kennecott institution and I have not been able to ascertain exactly what percentage of the medicines used are supplied by imble Health.

16. The medical assistant, Mr. William Reere, is a min very set in his ways. He insists that all patients wash thoroughly before visiting the aid post. The number of people who ingist that he has refused to treat them is rather high. So either their is a complete breekdern in communication or the situation is as it appears.

17. A general meeting was held at Tabubil, with various village people, camp manager Mr. C. Cole and Mr. W. Keare. The people expressed their grievances and an attempt was made to reacte the problem. Kennecott are the last last lot to want any strain on their relationship with the people of the area. The meeting at least brought the problem to a head if it did'nt completely resolve. I believe that Mr. Keare has stated that he is considering resignation. Although he is well paid, I think that he feelsthat the type of duty be performs,

is below his dignity and belittles his qualifications. He is probably better suited to directing rather than administering.

18. Mr. Cole has stated that Kennecott would be quite in agreement to allow an aid post orderly translatant to utilize the facilities provided. It is now up to P.H.D. to come good. A fair assessment of the population that could be trated from Tabubil would be to include all those in the star Mcu. tains C.D. a population of some 660, villagers from Bolongon in the Olsobip area 230, and the northern Mingerum villages of Manikite, Boliwogam, Mioksikwi, Kumguit and Tundenghiathwi, approx 300. This gives an approximate area population of some 1,190.

Education.
19. There are three teachers at Tabubil and the school is full to capacity. A large unabor of children from Gloslir are students mainly because of the added tonus of permanent caterial echool houses, from clothing and free rations all provided by Kennecott. The students do mental tasks around the school and comp, for an hour after classes, as a token attempt to term their keep.

Labour.

20. There is very little activity at Tabubil. A tradestore operates on a non profit basis, with any proceeds going to the school. The camp is maintained by a sheleton crewn, and the populace of the area are becoming shot of ready cash. A large number of men very preparing to travel to Telefomin in search of work, but I was able to contact Telefomin on a squadcall radio/ transmitter set, which saved them from making a useless trip.

Conclusion.

- 21. The mases of the land owners concerned with the area being used by Kenneco t in the Ok Munga gorge was obtained as required. A separate investigation report will be subsitted with a genealogy as instructed.
- 22. A shotgum incident involving the death of a Telefomin man at Tabubil caused me to stay a little longer than planned to carry out an investigation.
- The patrol accomplished it aim . Political education is needed in the area, and the people oppose to be responsive and willing to learn.

LEADERSUP

General:

The two elected Councillors in the North Oktedi Census Division are well respected by their costituents. They are Councillor Kerem Kurum representing Ambaga- Birinkamba villages and Councillor Beman Bunch representing Kungim -Kungembit villages. Two of these councillors have no formal education.

The younger semi-educated men are begining to show some interest in leadership but they could not get the support from the rest of the people especially the older ones. For example ayoung man at Birimkamba village told the natrol that he was interested in starting the rubber project but the rest of the villagers disliked his proposal.

The number of Students attending Kungin Primary School has now increased from 108 in the last Census to 111. There is no Standard One this year but the school caters students from Preparatory Class to Standard Five.

The teachers consist of three indigenous and two Montford Sisters. The Mead-Teacher of the school is Sister M. Viginia. It was found that the school would have an indigenous head teacher by early 1974.

The standard of literacy in the area is slowly improving. There, seven men from the Census Division employed by the Catholic Mission in Kiunga Sch-District, North Oktedi Census Division and elsewhere. One young man from the area is now a Broadcast Officer with the Department of Information and Extension Cervices. Another young man is at Goroka High School in the Bastern Highlands. The other three are attending the Balimo Vocational Centre in Balimo Sub-District.

STANDARD OF LIVING.

General:

Sept.

The Standard of Living in the Consus Division has immoved a little Nort of the houses in the villages were good. The people have also learnt to build pit latzines. In most cases the latzines were built outte close to the houses. The people were tald that building the latzinesclose to the houses was a health house.

The staple food in the area is sage supplement with benama and oweet potato. Only a very few people could afford to buy tin foodstuffs. There is a Community Centre at Kungim village. The patrol was told that the SAGANIZATION main perpose of the Centre was to teach the local women such things like cooking coving and general cleanliness. The centre is run under the guildness of the Markford Catholic Sisters.

MISSIONS

There are two Missions operating in the area. The Montford Catholic and Asian Pacific Christian Mission.

Montford Catholic Mission.

This Mission is very influencial in the Census Division at the present time. The Mission staffed by a Catholic Father and Three Sisters in based at Kungim village. Some of the local people are employed as casual labourers at the station. The Mission has a Trade Store, a School and a small Hospital. The hospital builing is almost falling down however, the new one is under constrution to replace it. There is also an airstrip at Kungim built by the Catholic Mission which is now used by the light aircrafts.

Asian Pacific Christian Mission.

The above Mission looks though it would be pulling out it activities from the area in the near future. The A.P.C.M. pastor at Birim-kamba village has already left and there has not been any replacement. The anly village in the area that has the A.P.C.M. pastor is Ambaga.

The Catholic Mission also has a small village school at Ambaga. Half of the Ambaga people have joined the Montford Catholic and the other with the Asian Pacific Christian Mission. Otherwise there is no sign of ill feelings between the two Missions.

POSSIBILITIES OF EXPENDING THE BUONOMY.

The only way in which the people in this area could earn some money at present is by working on the mad (Ningerum Council R.D.F.). There is a possibility of introducing activities such as Timber in the area. The Ambaga villagers have started pit sawing some timber already. They told the patial that the timber would be sold to the southern Council Mission at Emgin. The people in this Camsus Mivision should be encounsed to contain with what they have already started. This would help them to come more more; the Mingarum Council should be notified about the project so that it HIMPERSTERN would allocate come, its Rural improvement funds in this venture instead of all on roads. Otherwise it would be a warte of time encouraging the people KIMIN M in this project if no market is found for the products.

The people were sware that their Council has a los income at this stage therefore it could not very much to help develop the Council area. However, the people in this Census Division showed no ill feelings against the established Council.

In the past the people from his and have helped in the construction of Mingerus-Tope road. They have now started work on Kungin-Kungembit road which would eventually lead to Mirinkamba. Most of the men paid the Gouseil Tax when the patrol was in the sea.
