

Harold Wilson Mandeville Lecture cancelled

CANCELLATION OF MANDEVILLE LECTURE

Harold Wilson, former Prime Minister of Great Britain, scheduled to give the second Mandeville Lecture in the current series sponsored by the University of California, San Diego, has cancelled the engagement due to the "international situation."

Wilson was scheduled to speak at 8:00 p.m. Tuesday, January 9, in the Casa del Prado in Balboa Park. He had also been scheduled to visit several classes on the UCSD campus during the day and attend a dinner In his honor prior to his speech.

In a telegram to UCSD received on the campus Wednesday, January 3, Wilson said, "Deeply regret to say am obliged cancel next week's American lecture tour owing international situation and following American bombing Vietnam impossible being absent from Britain. Regrets, Harold Wilson."

The Mandeville lecture series will continue Friday, January 12, when Washington columnist Jack Anderson will speak at 8:00 p.m. in the Casa del Prado. Anderson will be followed by Sir Bernard Lovell, Director of Great Britain's Jodrell Bank Observatory on Thursday, February 15, also at 8:00 p.m. in the Casa del Prado. Both lectures are free and open to the public.
