

Chamber orchestra concert featuring Mendelssohn, Stravinsky and Schubert will be presented 9/10/73- Sherwood Hall

A chamber orchestra concert featuring music of Mendelssohn, Stravinsky and Schubert will be presented at 8:30 p.m. Friday, Aug. 10, in Sherwood Hall, La Jolla.

Rafael Druian, noted violinist and concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic will direct the "Ms (s) Concert" which is part of a special Summer Chamber Music Institute conducted by the University of California, San Diego.

Works to be performed are "Octet for Strings" by Mendelssohn, "Dumbarton Oaks Concerto" by Stravinsky and "Octet" by Schubert.

Tickets are \$3.50 each and may be purchased through the UCSD Department of Music or at The Turntable in La Jolla.

The program is the second in a series of three concerts during August sponsored by the UCSD Department of Music, the Friends of Chamber Music and UCSD's Summer Session.

The final concert, titled "Summer of '73," is scheduled for Thursday, Aug. 16, and will feature concert pianist Sidney Foster.

The 33-member chamber orchestra is made up of students enrolled in the Summer Session Chamber Music Institute, a four-week course in chamber music performance.

Druian also directed the course last year and served as a visiting senior lecturer and director of the Chamber Orchestra and Chamber Ensemble at UCSD during 1970 and 1971. He is a former concertmaster of the Cleveland, Minneapolis and Dallas orchestras.
