

### CGS 2B: Introduction to Critical Gender Studies: Gender and Institutions (4)

Woodhull, Winifred TuTh 3:30p - 4:50p

This course examines how gender organizes and is organized by institutions. Domains of inquiry may include family, education, medicine, technology, law, media, the workplace, immigration, and citizenship.

#### CGS 100: Conceptualizing Gender: Theory and Method

Kaplan, Sara Clarke. TuTh 2:00-3:20p

This course will compare the uses of gender as a category of analysis across academic disciplines in the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences with particular attention to research methodologies.

### **COCU 136: Concepts of Freedom**

Hartouni, Valeria. TuTh 12:30-1:50p

This course examines some of the changing cultural, social, technological, and political meanings, practices, and aspirations that together constitute what is, and has been, called Freedom. *Prerequisite:* COCU 100 or consent of the instructor.

#### HITO 199: Human Rights I: History and Theory

Meade, Everard. MW 5:00-6:20p

#### HIUS 115: History of Sexuality in the US

Shah, Nayan. TuTh 3:30-4:50p

Constructions of sex and sexuality in the United States from the time of pre-contact Native America to the present, focusing on sexual behaviors, sexual ideologies, and the uses of sexuality for social control.

### LTCS: Topics/Queer Cultures

El-Tayeb, Fatima. W 5:00-7:50p

This course examines the intersection of sex, sexuality, and popular culture by looking at the history of popular representations of queer sexuality and their relation to political movements for gay and lesbian rights. Repeatable for credit when readings and focus vary.

#### LTWL 123: Vampires in Literature

Lampert Weissig, Lisa. MWF 2:00-2:50p

No description.

#### **SOCI 129: The Family**

Klatch, Rebecca. MWF 9:00-9:50a

An examination of historical and social influences on family life. Analyzes contemporary families in the United States, the influences of gender, class, and race, and current issues such as divorce, domestic violence, and the feminization of poverty. *Prerequisite:* upper-division standing. Will not receive credit for SOCI 129 and SOCC 129.

#### SOCI 132: Gender and Work

Blair-Loy, Mary TuTh 9:30-10:50a

Examination and analysis of empirical research and theoretical perspectives on gender and work. Special attention to occupational segregation. Other topics include: the interplay between work and family; gender, work and poverty; gender and work in the Third World. *Prerequisite:* upper-division standing. Will not receive credit for SOCI 132 and SOCC 132.

#### SOCI 136E: Sociology of Mental Illness: A Historical Approach

Scull, Andrew. TuTh 9:30-10:50a

An examination of the social, cultural, and political factors involved in the identification and treatment of mental illness. This course will emphasize historical material, focusing on the eighteenth, nineteenth, and early twentieth centuries. Developments in England as well as the United States will be examined from an historical perspective. *Prerequisite:* upper-division standing. Will not receive credit for SOCI 136E and SOCC 136A.


Services – The Center, on any given day, provides different things for different community members Largest LGBT Center at any public university campus - 2,300 square feet of community space, Browsing library, reservable meetings rooms (25 person and 12 person capacities), computer lab, e-newsletter, LGBT Speaker's Bureau –members of UCSD's LGBT community sharing stories about their lives. Targeted training and education to classes, departments and organizations, individual consultations, community based counselor onsite on Wednesdays, shared with the Women's Center and Cross-Cultural Center. Work within Residential Life and Housing for LGBT Interest Housing and Gender Inclusive Housing options. LGBT scholarship program, six \$1,000 scholarships awarded annually to LGBT undergraduate students.

**Leadership Development Programs** – our signature work, which drives other traditional program offerings

- 8 undergraduate interns each academic year, paid internship which receive academic credit through AIP
- 2 Preuss School high school interns each academic quarter, receive academic credit through Preuss
- Over 30 trained, committed volunteers which staff the space, events and outreach activities


