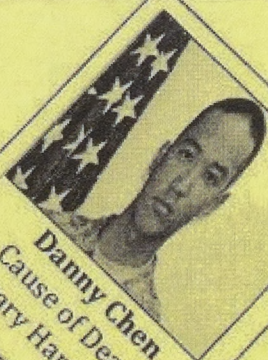

Boys in the Court

My Gender Action Project for the Women's Center will be a photography exhibition of gender-based street harassment that women and LGBTQIA folk face in their lives. "Street harassment is any action or comment between strangers in public places that is disrespectful, unwelcome, threatening and/or harassing and is motivated by gender" (www.streetharassment.org). **I encourage participants to respond to street harassment by taking a picture to document their experience. The camera lens can be a defense mechanism used to influence actions and behavior of the harasser who loses some sense of autonomy upon realizing that he or she is a visible object.**

Trust your instinct and respond to the situation in the way that you feel is most safe, which may mean deciding not to pull out the camera. Do not put yourself in danger. However, if you find yourself in a situation where the camera will jeopardize or threaten your safety, submit writing about that experience and how you chose to respond.

My goal for this project is to help empower victims of harassment, encourage individual action, and provide a space for dialogue about these experiences.

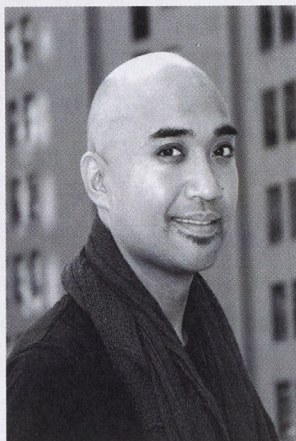

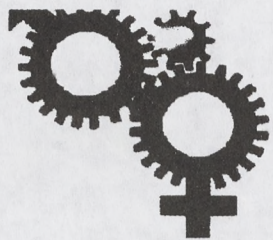
