My Dear Sir I have
got all the bills through the House
desired by you except the bill to amend
the Supervisor's act, To legalize the
acts of the recorder when acting as
the Auditor, A bill to give the Trustees
of San Diego police powers, and the bill
to authorizing the granting two leagues
of the pueblo lands to the rail road
company and the funding bill
but all of them except the two first
are still on the Clerk's table in the
Senate, yesterday I was in the Senate
Chamber urging Mr. Hoeland to
get them through, I was not at all
pleased with the Sr course the fact
is and the Los Angeles members will
bear me out in the assertion that
the Sen is of little force in the Senate

be so far as getting bill through
the Senate is concerned. I have taken
the pains to inform other Senators of
the reasons why we desire the passage
of these bills. The Senate and Assembly
are quarreling about the time of adjourn-
ment. I presume we shall get through
about the first of next month.
