Kenneth H. Drummond, formerly Assistant Director of the Smithsonian Institution's Astrophysical Observatory, has been appointed Assistant to Chief Campus Officer Roger Revelle at The University of California, La Jolla, Dr. Revelle announced this week.

A native of Riverside, Mr. Drummond attended Brown Military Academy and La Jolla High School, graduating in 1940. He is the son of Mrs. F. M. Drummond, 1261 Prospect St, La Jolla.

Mr. Drummond received his B.S. in Zoology from the University of Arizona in 1949 and did graduate work in Oceanography at Texas A & M College. During World War II he served as Commanding Officer of an LCI in the Pacific theatre. He was associated with the Marine Life Research Program at Scripps Institution of Oceanography during the period 1949-1950. From 1950 to 1957 he was with the Department of Oceanography and Meteorology at Texas A & M College in the capacity of Associate in Oceanography and Project Director. He was granted a year's leave of absence from Texas A & M in 1952 to serve as Senior Oceanographer on the U. S. Navy Hydrographic Office research vessel USS Sheldrake. From 1957 to July 1959 he was Administrator in charge of the Satellite Tracking Program for the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory. He is a member of the American Geophysical Union, Texas Academy of Science, American Society of Limnology and Oceanography, American Astronomical Society. He recently edited, with Charles A. Whitten, Geophysical Monograph Number 4 of the American Geophysical Union (Publication 708 of the National Academy of Sciences - National Research Council) on Contemporary Geodesy.

As Assistant to the Chief Campus Officer, Mr. Drummond will be responsible for all general, non-academic Departments on the La Jolla campus with the exception of Accounting and Budgeting. Mr. and Mrs. Drummond and their two children live at 369 Mesa Way, La Jolla, GL4-6318.
