

Series of three chamber orchestra concerts scheduled during August in Sherwood Hall

A series of three chamber orchestra concerts, under the direction of noted violinist Rafael Druian, have been scheduled during August in Sherwood Hall, La Jolla.

The concerts are part of a special Summer Chamber Music Institute conducted by the University of California, San Diego and are sponsored by the UCSD Department of Music, the Friends of Chamber Music, and UCSD's Summer Session. They are scheduled for 8:30 p.m. on Saturday, August 4; Friday, August 10; and Thursday, August 16.

Series tickets for the three concerts are \$9.00 each and single tickets are \$3.30 per concert. Patrons tickets are available at \$25.00 for two series tickets. Tickets may be purchased through the UCSD Department of Music with checks made payable to The Regents of the University of California.

The chamber orchestra will be made up of students enrolled in the Summer Session Chamber Music Institute, a four-week course in chamber music performance. The course is limited to 33 students with participants accepted on the basis of submitted tape recordings and in-person auditions.

The orchestra will include 12 violinists, 4 violists, 4 cellists, 2 basses, 10 woodwinds, and 1 percussionist.

The first concert will be an all Mozart performance under the title of Mozart in August.~ The August 10 performance is titled "Ms (s) Concert" and will consist of works by Felix Mendelssohn, Igor Stravinsky, and Franz Schubert. The final concert, titled "Summer of '73," will include works by Giovanni Battista Pergolesi, Franz Joseph Haydn, Mozart, Charles Ives, and Ernest Bloch. The final concert will feature concert pianist Sidney Foster who will join Druian in performing Mozart's Concerto in D-Major for piano and orchestra.

Raiael Druian is the present Concertmaster of The New York Philharmonic and former Concertmaster of The Cleveland, Minneapolis, and Dallas Orchestras. He has directed the Summer Chamber Orchestra and Chamber Ensemble at UCSD since 1970.
