Transcription:

I send greetings to all those observing Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBT) Community Center Awareness Day on September 15.

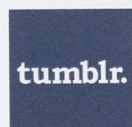

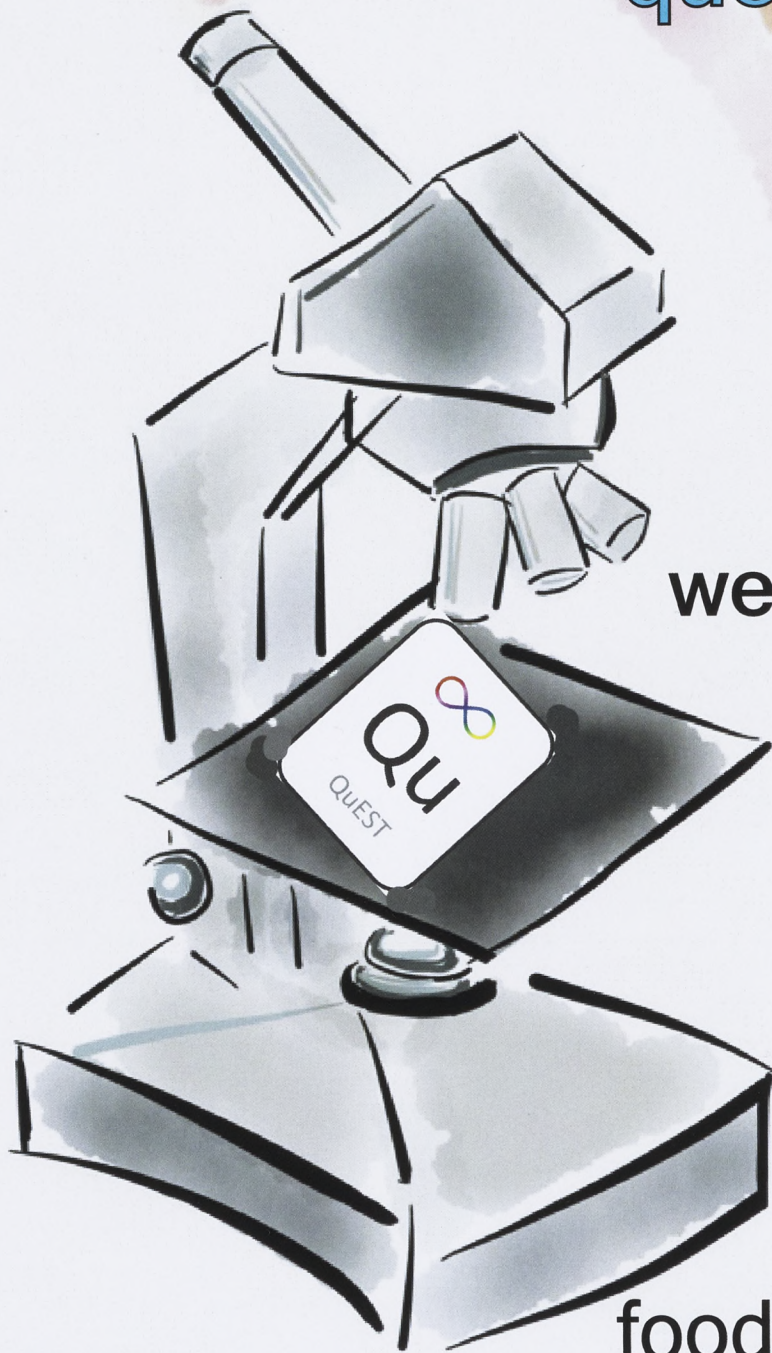

UC SAN DIEGO LGBT RESOURCE CENTER'S 15TH ANNIVERSARY SYMPOSIUM

CeCe McDonald was imprisoned for defending herself against a racist, transphobic assault in July, 2010. Due to her willingness to fight, supporters and activists in Minneapolis and across the U.S. built up a solidarity campaign to demand her freedom, and were able to win her a reduced sentence. After serving a 17-month term, she was released in January 2014. After being released CeCe quickly became a leading and outspoken fighter in the movements for LGBTQ liberation, prison abolition, and racial justice. She is currently working on a forthcoming documentary with actress Laverne Cox on her case, "Free CeCe." She was the Grand Marshall of Seattle Pride this year, she received the Bayard Rustin Civil Rights award, and has spoken on Democracy Now!, MSNBC, and various other media outlets.

Janetta Johnson is an Afro-American Transsexual from Tampa, Florida. She moved to San Francisco in 1997, where she has worked in various capacities at non-profits and social service agencies. She recently survived 3 years in federal prison and is committed to developing strategies and interventions to reduce the recidivism rate of the transgender community. Janetta's involvement with TGI Justice dates back to 2006.

Miss Major is a black, formerly incarcerated, transgender elder. She has been an activist and advocate in her community for over forty years. She was at the Stonewall uprising in 1969, became politicized at Attica, was an original member of the first all-transgender gospel choir, and is a father, mother, grandmother, and grandfather to her own children, and to many in the transgender community. Currently, Miss Major is the Executive Director of TGI Justice where she instills hope and a belief in a better future to the girls that are currently incarcerated and those coming home.

Reina Gossett lives in Fort Greene, Brooklyn and believes creativity & imagination are vital in movements for self-determination. She is a trans activist & artist, working as membership director at the Sylvia Rivera Law Project and blogging at reinagossett.com. Reina's work has been featured in BCRW's The Scholar & Feminist Online, as well as Captive Genders: Trans Embodiment & The Prison Industrial Complex. She is an activist fellow at BCRW.

Eric A. Stanley is a President's Postdoctoral fellow in Communication and Critical Gender Studies at UCSD and is the editor of Captive Genders: Trans Embodiment and the Prison Industrial Complex. Along with Chris Vargas, Eric directed the films Homotopia and Criminal Queers.

The UCSD LGBT Staff and Faculty Association is the official faculty and staff association for the gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender folks at UCSD. They provide the opportunity for faculty and staff to meet new people at the University and make connections that will last your entire career.

15 YEARS ON UC SAN DIEGO'S CAMPUS

The history of LGBT communities on UC San Diego's campus span back to the late 70s when students formed organizations to create community and demand change. However, beginning in the early 1990s, concerned staff, faculty, and student activists sought to establish institutional support for the LGBT campus community and its issues, similar to what was happening on UC campuses across the state, and after the establishment of UC San Diego's Women's and Cross-Cultural Centers. After numerous reports, meetings and formal requests, UC San Diego Chancellor Robert C. Dynes formally dedicating the LGBT Resource Center on Nov. 8, 1999.

Beginning as a small, two room operation with only 300 square feet and referred to as an Office not a Center, the LGBT Resource Center has since experienced dramatic growth. The Center was housed in temporary space (a beloved double-wide trailer) of 960 square feet at University Center 312 from February 2002 until May of 2006. When the Center opened its current home in the Original Student Center area of campus, it was the largest LGBT Center on any public university campus at 2,300 square feet.

But the Center is more than just a building. The Center is a hub of community life for those most at the intersections of identity and community around gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity and a host of other ways of being that often tap into great resiliency. The Center builds student leadership through an innovative intern program that not only provides a wage, but also academic credit, focusing on the praxis between theory and practice of LGBT issues in academia and the larger society.

And beyond the building and its people, the Center presents innovative and community building programs through signature events, weekly groups, hosting organizations, addressing policy, dedicated training and fundamental education. Q Camp, World AIDS Day, the Transgender Days of Empowerment and Remembrance, Out and Proud Week, Rainbow Graduation and our participation in San Diego LGBT Pride anchor each year in powerful opportunities for creating connections, learning and celebration.

The Center, its people and its program thrive on the support of the community, both on and off campus. Student volunteers regularly staff our space, employees volunteer for panels to educate our community, all are involved in intergenerational dialogues, and many donate regularly to support the good work of the Center. Fifteen years ago, student, staff and faculty celebrated a beginning. Today we honor the sustaining work of our Center; a Center committed to the liberation of our community from oppressive intersecting systems and structures.
