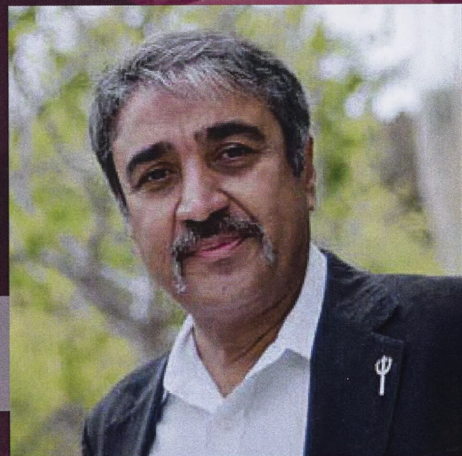

NASA has worked to create and institutionalize a variety of resources and support to ensure our purpose as a student organization is not only accomplished but also sustained.

SPACES

The mission of the Student Promoted Access Center for Education and Service (SPACES) is to act as an empowering dynamic on campus where UCSD students collaborate to achieve greater educational equity.
