TWO UCSD LITERATURE PROFESSORS HONORED

Page duBois and Lisa Lowe, professors in the Department of Literature at the University of California, San Diego have received recent recognition for their work.

DuBois has been selected as one of 12 Getty Scholars for 1998 by the Getty Research Institute for the History of Art and the Humanities.

A professor of classics and comparative literature, duBois received her bachelor's degree in Greek and English from Stanford University and her master's and doctorate degrees in comparative literature from UC Berkeley. She has been on the UCSD faculty since 1972.

DuBois will be in residence at the Institute in Brentwood from January through December of 1998 where she will join the other Getty scholars and a number of visiting scholars and pre- and postdoctoral fellows from varying disciplines. The theme for the 1998 Scholars and Seminars Program is "Representing the Passions."

Currently located in Santa Monica, the Getty Institute will move to Brentwood in the fall of 1997. Selected Getty scholars have been invited to the Institute's program since 1985.

Lowe has been elected to a three-year term on the Board of Editors of American Literature by the American Literature Section of the Modern Language Association.

Lowe's election recognizes her contribution to the study of American literature.

A professor of comparative literature, Lowe received her bachelor's degree in history from Stanford University and her doctorate in literature from UC Santa Cruz. She has been on the UCSD faculty since 1986.
