Piano teacher Robert Turner appointed to Music Department as lecturer

Robert Turner, a noted master teacher of piano, has accepted an appointment as Lecturer in the Department of Music at the University of California, San Diego. Turner, who lives in Santa Monica, will travel to the UCSD campus to coach students in the Music Department's "Studies in Chamber Music" program.

Turner has held positions as Instructor in Music at the University of Washington, University of Southern California, and UCLA. Many of his students have distinguished themselves as solo performers with southern California orchestras and ensembles and several have been awarded scholarships to such schools as the Music Academy of the West, the Aspen School of Music, and the Curtis Institute.
