

New York Chamber soloists to perform

The New York Chamber Soloists will give a concert of works by Mozart, Aitken, Haydn, Vivaldi, Beethoven and Bach, at 8:30 p.m., Thursday, October 12 at Sherwood Hall, La Jolla.

The concert is sponsored by the University of California, San Diego, Committee for Arts and Lectures and is the first in a series of Chamber Music Concerts. Reserved seating is available for \$3.00 for the public and \$1.00 for UCSD students.

The Los Angeles Times said about a recent performance, "A bevy of excellent musicians entirely flexible in repertoire and period. The performances were perfect in coordination, interpretation and cooperation."

Their repertoire extends from Monteverdi through today and encompasses over 250 works, including chamber music for voice or voices and instruments, and for instrumental combinations alone.

Appearing in the Thursday evening program will be Charles Bressler, tenor; Albert Fuller, harpsichord; Melvin Kaplan, oboe; Alexander Kouguell, cello; Ynez Lynch, viola; John Solum, flute; Harriet Wingreen, pianoharpsichord, and Isidore Cohen, violin.

The group has had a number of engagements throughout the United States and has made five European tours, which have included performances in the major capitals of Europe, a private concert for the Prince and Princess of Monaco and appearances under the Cultural Presentations Program of the Department of State.
