

J. H. Clark said his talk will emphasize critical stage in the campus's development, and its dependence on outcome of Proposition 1-A

The planned evolution of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography into a full-fledged University of California campus will be described by UCSD's ranking administrative officer to the Kiwanis Club of Oceanside meeting at the Colonial Hotel at noon Tuesday, October 16.

J. H. Clark, newly appointed Assistant Chancellor to Chancellor Herbert York, said his talk will emphasize the current critical stage in the campus's development, and its dependence on the outcome of Proposition 1-A on the November ballot.

Fifty thousand youngsters now in high school-- just double the state-wide University enrollment-- will be turned away in the next ten years unless the building program goes forward," said Clark. "I want to talk about the construction plans of our local campus and the effect a full-fledged University could have on the County's cultural and economic life."
