

"The Perfection of Imperfection" on exhibit

"The Perfection of Imperfection," an exhibit of paintings and prints by Hanne Lauridsen, will be shown in the Mandeville Annex Gallery at the University of California, San Diego from September 22-26.

The Annex Gallery is located in room B-118 of the Mandeville Center. Gallery hours are noon to 5 p.m. A reception for the artist is scheduled from 5-8 p.m. September 23 in the gallery.

Lauridsen, a first-year graduate student in the Department of Visual Arts at the university, earned her bachelor's degree in art and art history at UC Berkeley. Before turning to art as a course of study and career, she was a pharmacist in Denmark and Norway.

Her work is colorful and primitivistic. She works with oils, acrylics and charcoal on canvas. Lauridsen also experiments with the art of making paper, and some of these works will be displayed.

"In art, I find so many people are striving for perfection and eventually are becoming neurotic," she said. "In my art, I try to convey the joy of imperfection."
