DIANA DEUTSCH, RESEARCH PSYCHOLOGIST, AWARDED FELLOW BY THE AUDIO ENGINEERING SOCIETY

RAMON A. GUTIERREZ, ASSISTANT PROF. OF HISTORY, RECEIVES 1986 CONFERENCE PRIZE BY THE CONFERENCE OF LATIN AMERICAN HISTORY

Ramon A. Gutierrez, Assistant Professor of History, University of California, San Diego, was awarded the 1986 Conference Prize by the Conference on Latin American History for the best article on Latin America in an English-language journal. The article, "Honor Ideology, Marriage Negotiation, and Class-Gender Domination in New Mexico, 1690-1846," appeared in the Winter 1985 issue of Latin American Perspectives. Leon Zamosc, Assistant Professor of Sociology, University of California, San Diego, has received the Herring Award for the Best Book of 1986 for his book The Agrarian Question and the Peasant Movement in Colombia. The award--named after Hubert Herring, a scholar who devoted his life to the fostering of Latin American Studies--is presented annually by the Pacific Coast Council on Latin American Studies.
