

UCSD faculty will participate in 144th meeting of the American Chemical Society at Los Angeles, 3/31-4/5/63

Several members of the University of California, San Diego, faculty will participate in the 144th meeting of the American Chemical Society at Los Angeles, March 31-April 5.

Martin D. Kamen, Professor of Chemistry, will be presented with the ACS Award for Nuclear Applications in Chemistry, a \$1,000 prize sponsored by the Nuclear-Chicago Corporation, on April 2.

Dr. Kamen, a leading member of the team that first used radiocarbon to study photosynthesis, will deliver the award address at the meeting, entitled "The Early History of Carbon-14."

Roger Revelle, Director of the Scripps Institution of Oceanography and University Dean of Research, will speak at a Divisional Dinner on Wednesday night, April 30.

Milner B. Schaefer, Director of the Institute of Marine Resources, will participate in a "Symposium on Economic Importance of Chemicals from the Sea." He will discuss "The Sea as a Source of Organic Chemicals." S. Jonathan Singer, Professor of Biology in the School of Science and Engineering, will participate in a symposium, "Kinetics of Specific Hapten-Antibody Reactions."
