UCSD TO HOLD SYMPOSIUM ON FEMINISM & THE LAW MAY 13

A symposium on "Feminism and the Law," sponsored by the University of California's Women's Center and the University of San Diego School of Law will be held at UCSD Wednesday, May 13 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m.

The symposium panelists, who will discuss how scholars are approaching law from a feminist viewpoint, will include a panel of speakers followed by a discussion panel. The speakers are: Professor Christine Littleton, UCLA Law School; Sheila Kuehl, an attorney with California Women's Law Center; and Professor Carrie Menkel-Meadow, also from UCLA Law School. The discussants will include: Professor Val Hartouni, UCSD Communication Department; Judge Judith McConnell, San Diego Superior Court; and Professor Larry Alexander, USD School of Law.
