FORMER MAYOR OF WASHINGTON, D.C. TO SPEAK AT UCSD

Walter E. Washington, 78, mayor of Washington, D.C. from 1967 to 1979, will discuss "The New Era of African/American Democracy" at 3 p.m. May 30 in the International Center, University of California, San Diego.

The lecture, free and open to the public, is presented by the UCSD African and African-American Studies Research Project.

Washington was the first lecturer four years ago when the research project was initiated. He is the father of Bennetta Jules-Rosette, coordinator of the African and African-American Studies Research Project, UCSD Department of Sociology. His informal talk will cover events that shaped his life, and particularly politics and politicians of the 70's.

He will be introduced by Jonathan Holloway, assistant professor of Ethnic Studies, UCSD. A reception will follow the lecture.
