

Thomas G. Lanphier, Jr. appointed as consultant to the UCSD Foundation at UCSD announced by Dr. William McElroy

The appointment of Thomas G. Lanphier, Jr., as consultant to the U. C. San Diego Foundation at the University of California, San Diego has been announced by Dr. William McElroy, UCSD Chancellor. Lanphier, of La Jolla, will work with the Foundation in the development of the corporate gifts program.

The U. C. San Diego Foundation was established in 1972 as a public non-profit corporation designed to encourage and administer private gifts, bequests, and trusts for the benefit of the San Diego campus. Through its work, the Foundation is able to provide financial assistance to the campus for the support of its teaching, research, and public service functions and programs.

Lanphier, a resident of the La Jolla area for the past 23 years, served as Vice President of Planning and Government Sales for Convair in San Diego for nine years. He has also served as President of Fairbanks Morse, Inc., in Chicago and in top management positions with Raytheon Company in Boston, Massachusetts, International Business Exchange in Los Angeles, and Rapidair Freight in Los Angeles.

He received a B. A. degree in journalism from Stanford University in 1941. He served in the Army Air Force during World War II and later as editor of the Idaho Daily Statesman in Boise, Idaho. He has also served as Assistant to the Secretary of the Air Force for Research and Development and on the Senior Staff of the National Security Council in Washington, D.C.

Lanphier is married to the former Phyllis Ada Fraser and he and his wife have five daughters.
