an 8 to 4 vote in the Education an 8 to 4 vote in the Education Committee and, because coauthor John Vasconcellos chairs the Ways and Means Committee, it is expected to
pass there and be on the assembly floor in about two weeks.
The bill, if passed, would "request" that the Regents "investigate the possibility of the conversion" of the labs and terminate the administrative Department of Energy for operation of the laboratories operation of the laboratories

Such a resolution, however is not codified by the state, meaning that the regents would not be legally bound to take any immediate action,

## The Ties That Bind

According to the UC Poseidon submarine ICBM Student Lobby (UCSL), the systems, and the B6l Bomb laboratories (and, by virtue of close association, the University) have played a pivotal role in the development of the United States nuclear arsenal for the past 40 years. Among the UCSL's findings:

- The Los Alamos and
 Lawrence Livermore National Laboratorles havedeveloped 65 percent of havedeveloped maior nuclear weapons all major nuclear weapons in stockpile today.
- The Fat Man and Little Boy bombs dropped on Nagasaki and Hiroshima were developed and tested at Los Alamos under University of California management during the Manhattan Project
- All of the strategic warheads that entered the national stockpile in the late $70^{\circ}$ s and early 80's were developed at Los Alamos. These include Minuteman III ICBM's. Trident and
warhead.
- The University of California serves essential y as a "benevolen andlord" to the Labs and has little influenceon actual weapons-related programs The Labs are "federally owned, federally financed and carry out research of federal defense and energy policies.
All of this is not lost on the lab management. In lact, Livermore's Instituional Plan 1978-84 states
