

A record enrollment of more than 7,200 students is expected to begin work at UCSD

A record enrollment of more than 7,200 students is expected to begin work Monday, September 25, when fall quarter classes begin at the University of California, San Diego.

The fall quarter actually begins Monday, September 18 with the first week being spent on last minute registration, class scheduling, and housing needs. The expected student enrollment represents a 12 per cent increase over fall enrollment one year ago.

A total of 5,450 undergraduate-students are expected to attend classes at Revelle, John Muir, and Third Colleges. Some 1,455 graduate students are also expected to enroll with 165 of them located at Scripps Institution of Oceanography and another 226 in the School of Medicine. In addition, the School of Medicine will also enroll approximately 310 interns and residents and 115 post-doctoral and graduate students who will be located on the UCSD campus and at University Hospital in San Diego.

Students returning to the campus following summer vacation will be greeted by a new campus entrance and the relocation of several student service offices. Landscaping along the southern entrance to the campus on Gilman Drive, which connects UCSD with Interstate 5 has been completed giving a park-like approach to the campus through a tall grove of eucalyptus trees.

Gilman Drive is now being extended to connect directly with the Veteran's Hospital located east of the main campus. To make room for the extension, a portion of Building 250 on the Matthews Campus had to be destroyed, Building 250, formerly a Marine Corps barracks, housed the offices of the Dean of Students, Student Housing, Religious Affairs, Financial Aids, Urban and Rural Studies, and several student run organizations.

Some of the offices will remain in the smaller, rebuilt structure, but others have already been scattered around the campus where they will remain until a planned student center is built. The student center, to be paid for from student fees, is expected to begin construction late in the fall quarter.

Construction is also expected to begin during the year on a two-story student health center designed to accommodate a clinic, infirmary, and pharmacy, additional gymnasium facilities; and a \$5.2 million Fine Arts Building which will house office, classroom, and work space for the Departments of Music, Visual Arts, and Drama. A 900-seat auditorium, designed for concerts, drama productions, and lecture programs, will be an integral part of the building.

Several new campus administrators, appointed late last year or during the summer, will begin their duties with the opening of the fall quarter. Chancellor William D. McElroy, who has been at UCSD since February, will begin his first full academic year.

Dr. Murray Goodman, Professor of Chemistry at UCSD, will serve as Acting Provost of Revelle College succeeding Dr. Paul Saltman who was named Vice Chancellor Academic Affairs in February. Dr. Ernest Mort will serve as Acting Dean of Revelle College succeeding Tom Hull who resigned to serve as assistant to Vice Chancellor Saltman. Mort has served as Resident Dean at Revelle College for several years.

Dr. Kenneth L. Bowles, Director of the UCSD Computer Center since 1967, has been named to the newly established post of Assistant to the Vice Chancellor Academic Affairs for Computer Affairs. He will act as chief scientist and adviser to Saltman on all matters concerning computers and their utilization on campus.

Named as new director of EOP for UCSD is William A.T. Byrd, who had formerly served in a similar post at Columbia University in New York City. New department chairmen for the 1972-73 Academic year include Dr. Eric Reissner, Applied Mechanics and Engineering Sciences; Dr. Arthur Wagner, former professor of drama at Tulane University, who becomes the first full-time chairman in drama; Dr. Richard Attiyeh, economics; Dr. Edward Klima, linguistics; Dr. Samuel Yen, obstetrics and gynecology in the School of Medicine; Dr. Nathan Zvaifler, acting chairman of medicine; and Dr. Joseph Kraut, acting chairman of chemistry.

New to the UCSD faculty this year is noted conductor Edwin London who will serve as a visiting professor in the Department of Music and as conductor of the La Jolla Civic-University Orchestra and Chorus. London replaces Thomas Nee who is on a year's leave of absence to conduct the Minneapolis Civic Orchestra.

University Extension, the adult education program run by the University of California, will also begin its fall quarter September 25. Enrollment in the 300 courses to be offered is expected to reach 7,500 students.

The Extended University, a newly-devised part-time degree program, begins this fall with a limited enrollment of 50 persons. The program is a result of the need to increase opportunities for employed adults to earn degrees without residency on campus. Work toward the Bachelor of Arts and Master of Sciences degrees will be offered.
