

Harold Temmer appointed Registrar and Admissions Officer, Ronald J. Bowker appointed as his assistant

Harold E. Temmer, director of Admissions and Records at California State College at Los Angeles for two years, has been appointed as Registrar and Admissions Officer at the University of California, San Diego.

R. James Bowker, senior administrative analyst and operations officer in Temmer's office in Los Angeles, was appointed as Assistant to the Registrar and Admissions Officer at UCSD. The appointments are effective on Sept. 1 of this year.

UCSD expects to enroll some 3,800 graduate and undergraduate students, including the first medical students, this fall.

Temmer received a B.S. and an M.S. in Mathematics from the University of Illinois. He has taught at Biarritz American University in France and at the University of Illinois. His administrative positions include: assistant director, Division of Special Services for War Veterans, 1946; head of the Office of Admissions and Records, 1946-1966; and Dean of Summer Sessions at the University of Illinois.

Temmer is a member of the Pacific Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers, vice president for professional activities in the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers and past president of the Illinois Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers.

Bowker received a B.S. in Humanities from Loyola University in Chicago and an M.S. in Public Administration from California State College at Los Angeles.

He has taught at Sandwich High School and the McHenry School District in Illinois. His administrative positions include: assistant project director, National Merit Scholarship Program, 1960-1961; project director, American College Testing Program, 1961-1962; project director, National Merit Scholarships and American College Testing Program, 1962-1964; and director, National Testing Programs, 1964-1966.
