

Dr. Gabriel Jackson gives second PILS lecture

Dr. Gabriel Jackson, professor of history at the University of California, San Diego, will present the second lecture in the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series at 4:15 p.m., Thursday, October 17, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle College campus.

Dr. Jackson's topic will be "The Intellectual Baggage of an Historian."

He was the first member of Department of History at UCSD. He earned his Ph.D. from the University of Toulouse in France. He has received two Fulbright Fellowships, as well as the History and Literature prize from Harvard. Formerly he taught at Wellesley College and Knox College.

Dr. Jackson's specialization is Spanish history. Princeton University Press published his book, *The History of the Spanish Republic and Civil War, 1931-1939*, in 1965. In 1967 Dr. Jackson was awarded the Herbert Baxter Adams prize by the American Historical Association for his book. He also wrote "The Spanish Civil War: Domestic Crisis or International Conspiracy" for an anthology of source readings called *Problems of European Civilization*, published by Heath and Co. in 1967.

The lecture will be free and open to the public.
