PIANIST CECIL LYTLE TO PERFORM IN CABARET STYLE AT UCSD

Cecil Lytle, pianist and a provost at the University of California, San Diego, will perform a jazz program in cabaret with Hollis Gentry, Gunnar Biggs and percussionist Leon Alexander at the UCSD Faculty Club, at 8 p.m. Saturday, January 27.

The group will perform original jazz compositions by Biggs, a contrabassist; Gentry, a saxophonist, and Lytle.

Lytle, a jazz artist and classical pianist, is one of the country's leading exponents of compositions by Scriabin, whose works are considered to be extremely difficult to interpret.

In 1988, Lytle accepted the post of provost of Third College, one of five of the UCSD's colleges, which this year is celebrating its 20th anniversary.

This event is open to the public. Tickets are \$8 for general admission and \$6 for students. Refreshments and a no-host bar will be available. Tickets may be purchased from the UCSD Box Office, from TicketMaster outlets or at the door. Seating is limited. For information call 534-4559.
