

3rd Annual Economics Policy Seminar Series

March 4, 1985

Dr. Alan Sinai, the chief economist for Shearson Lehman/American Express, and Dr. Clive Granger, professor of economics, will be the featured speakers at the third University of California Department of Economics Policy Seminar Series Tuesday, March 12, at 4 p.m.

The title of their talk, to be held at Liebow Auditorium in the Basic Science Building, will be "Structural Change, Economic Forecasting and the Economic Outlook." The seminar is open to the public and admission is free.

Sinai is the former vice president and chief economist for Data Resources, Inc., with responsibilities for that organization's financial forecasts of the U.S. economy. His views are regularly cited in the New York Times, Business Week, the Los Angeles Times and other media.

He is the author of "Forecasting Economic Time Series," "Predictability of Stock Market Prices," and "Speculation, Hedging and Forecasting of Commodity Prices," as well as some 90 research papers in statistics and economics.

Sinai has taught at the University of Illinois, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Boston University. He is currently adjunct professor of economics in the Graduate Business School at New York University.

Granger has been a professor of economics at UCSD since 1974. He is a former professor of mathematics and head of the economics department at the University of Nottingham in England.

Granger is the author of several books including "Forecasting in Business and Economics," published in 1980. He has also written numerous papers and has served on the editorial boards of several professional journals.
