# UCSD to open largest LGBT Center in the Nation May 6th, 2006, 10:30am, UCSD



On Saturday May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2006 at 10:30am the University of California, San Diego will open the largest Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender Resource Center at any public institution of higher education in the nation.

Designed by the chief partners Jim Brown and James Gates from the San Diego award-winning architecture firm PUBLIC, the building sits amongst the eucalyptus grove in the landmark park area in the heart of the UCSD campus. At 2,700 square feet, the LGBT Resource Center is host to numerous resources for the UCSD community, including the David Bohnett Wireless CyberCenter, a unique lab environment composed

entirely of laptop computers and dedicated to allowing students, staff, faculty members and researchers easy, accessible technology in a comfortable, welcoming atmosphere.

The Grand Opening ceremony will begin at 10:30am, and will feature UCSD's Chancellor Marye Anne Fox, current students and representatives of the San Diego LGBT community. Immediately following the ceremony, tours of the space will be offered by the UCSD student organization Queer People of Color, and light refreshments will be served.

The UCSD student organization Queer by Nature will continue the festivities with an afternoon barbecue and evening bonfire at the beach on La Jolla Shores. Later that evening, the student organization LGBTQIA will host its non-sexist dance, now in its 25<sup>th</sup> year on UCSD's campus, and San Diego's largest all ages LGBT dance party. The dance is at the Stage at Porter's Pub from 9pm until 1am. The Grand Opening day festivities complete a week's worth of events focusing on the LGBT community, UCSD's annual Out and Proud week.

"Being back in the Original Student Center, we've really come full circle in our journey. Our family has grown so much and this is such a great step forward in making us more visible not only as a resource to the UCSD community but also to show that we exist and share in this community as well. This permanent space is ground-breaking and a real testament to the queer and ally students, staff, and faculty who've helped to make it become reality. I'm really proud of our family," said Peper Anan, 4th year undergraduate student.

The Center includes a large community space, conference room, meeting room, staff offices, community kitchen and extensive browsing library. The library also hosts the personal and professional collections of UCSD's Dr. David McWhirter and the late Dr. Drew Mattison, authors of the ground-breaking book <u>The Male Couple</u>.

Within the space is the bronze sculpture "Lady and Bear" by the renowned artist Boris Blai, a student of August Rodin and founding Dean of the Tyler School of Art at Temple University in Pennsylvania. The artwork was

graciously donated by Mr. Michael Marx, co-founder of the Michael L. Marx and Donald K. Marshall Scholarship for Gay and Lesbian Students, the first LGBT scholarship at UCSD, and one of four annual \$1,000 scholarships for continuing UCSD LGBT students. The Christopher B. Arrott Endowed Scholarship, the Russ Ty Scholarship and the LGBT Resource Center Scholarship all serve to support undergraduate students are who are actively involved in the UCSD LGBT community.

This move represents an historic moment in the life of both the LGBT Resource Center and the LGBT community at UCSD. In 1992 a request from a single student representing the UCSD organization now called LGBTQIA said, "What LGBA really needs is a resource center for lesbians, gays, and bisexuals." The Chancellor's Advisory Committee on LGBT issues (CACLGBTI) recommended a staffed Resource Center which resulted in a formal request submitted to then Chancellor Robert C. Dynes on September 10, 1998.

In November 1999, Chancellor Dynes officially dedicated a temporary 300 square feet space on campus for an LGBT Resource Office. In February 2002, the Resource Office was renamed a Center and moved to a 960 square feet transitional location in the University Center neighborhood. Four years later, the Resource Center is now in its permanent home, staffed by three full-time professionals, eight student employees, and is host to numerous student, staff and faculty organizations and groups.

"The Center represents a fundamental, long term commitment from UC President Bob Dynes and UCSD Chancellor Marye Anne Fox to a diverse, open and public space for all members of the university community to explore issues relating to sexual and gender identities, practices and politics," said Shaun Travers, Director of the LGBT Resource Center.

The LGBT Resource Center is a member of the UCSD Campus Community Centers, along with the Women's Center and the Cross-Cultural Center. The Campus Community Centers collaborate on a variety of programs and issues. By understanding and appreciating our diverse histories and experiences, the Centers have found the common connections that bring them together to create strong communities through joint activities and events. The specific mission of each Campus Community Center focuses its individual endeavors towards social justice and inclusion, and combine to create a synergy of improving climate for all communities at UCSD. It is valuing differences and recognizing commonalities that energize and drive the overall work of the Campus Community Centers.
