But for those who were, PK's are Preacher's Kids, and PK's have unique upbringings. But being a PK must have instilled a sense of service, because Andy has certainly stepped up for our community.


the needs of its constituents. Andy and his partner Skip have deeply integrated their identity into their lives, so much so that it is a non-issue, it simply is.

Same-Sex Marriage Research Group

McNeal, Keith Assistant Professor Anthropology..."I'd like to connect with people -- students, staff, faculty, etc. -- who would be interested in participating in a research think-tank on the politics of same-sex marriage. Our goals would be something like: (a) to divvy up our labor on all issues related to the matter -- history, politics, debate, ethics, rhetoric, etc. -- for systematic research and analysis; and (b) to organize the information in an integrated way in order to produce some kind of user-friendly document on the topic with all data, analysis, commentary, and talking points pursuant to rebutting opponents of gay marriage and hopefully influencing the terrain of the debate. We could have an initial meeting and I would be willing to speak about my ideas and some of my preliminary thoughts on the topic: then the group could move out from there. If you're

The Spirit of Stonewall Rally - Free Event Friday, July 28th at 7PM

Balboa Park - Marston Point, 6th & Juniper

The rally is an opportunity for us to stand together and celebrate our shared vision of freedom and equality. This outdoor rally commemorates 1969 Stonewall Uprising in New York's Greenwich Village, which is considered to be the commencement of the contemporary Lesbian and Gay liberation movement.

The rally will kick off San Diego's LGBT Pride weekend, which continues with a mile-long parade the next day at 11 a.m., July 29th, down University Avenue, and a two-day festival, July 29th and July 30th at Marston Point in Balboa Park.

Featured speakers include:

- Rev. Troy D. Perry, founder of Metropolitan Community Church
- Bixi B. Craig, Publisher, Lavender Lens -California's News and Life-style Magazine for Lesbians and Friends
- Neil Giuliano, President of the Gay & Lesbian Alliance Against Defamation (GLAAD)
- Juba Kalamka, founding member of "homohop" crew Deep Dickollective

Additionally, Shaun Travers will be publicly recognized for his Pride Award at this event.

Parade Staging Area Saturday, July 29th at 8:30 AM

Our contingent (UCSD shuttle and VIP vehicle) will be staging on Normal Street between Lincoln and Blaine, across and on the other side of the street from the DMV. We are officially space #52, and in staging zone H. Please arrive by 9:30am!

The easiest way to get there from UCSD is to take the 163 south to Washington Street East. At the top of the off ramp turn right. At Washington, turn right, then continue down towards Brian's American Eatery. Normal Street is the second light after Brians. But don't plan on parking there. Good luck with parking!

You are advised to park in the Old Navy Hospital Parking Lot on Park Blvd at Presidents Way (east side of Balboa Park). Shuttles will be running and will drop you off at the line-up area. These shuttles will be running from near the end of the parade route, as well, to take you back to your car.

Get on the UCSD bus for the Pride Parade! Saturday, 11 AM

LGBT Pride event. Travers will be recognized on July 28 during a rally in Balboa Park and will get to ride a vintage convertible on July 29 during the 2006 San Diego LGBT Pride Parade, with UCSD's float right behind him.

Everyone in the UCSD community is invited to join the celebration. Travers said he was incredibly honored and surprised when he found out about the award. "It felt humbling to be highlighted as one of many who do really good work," he said. Travers received the Spirit of Stonewall community service award for his leadership on the UCSD campus and his role on the San Diego LGBT Community Leadership Council, said Ron deHarte, executive director of San Diego Pride.

The award goes to up-and-coming leaders within the LGBT community, deHarte said. "We're just pleased to see that Shaun was recognized," deHarte said. "We appreciate his service not only to students on campus, but to the community overall." The award takes its name from the 1969 Stonewall gay rights riots in New York City.

Travers became the director of UCSD's LGBT Resource Center in May 2001. He also serves as secretary of the San Diego LGBT Community Center and is a member of the San Diego LGBT Community Leadership Council. The center provides programs, activities services to improve the wellbeing of San Diego's LGBT community. The council aims to help bring together the many organizations serving San Diego's LGBT community.

As you may have read, UCSD will have a shuttle, sponsored by UCSD's Umbrella Group, for our main vehicle in this year's San Diego Pride Parade. If you have not marched/participated with UCSD's contingent in the parade in past years due to the length of parade/heat/mobility issues/etc., please join us! We strongly encourage you to ride on the shuttle as first priority folks! E-mail Samuel Santos at s2santos@ucsd.edu to confirm your spot! And welcome aboard the bus!

Parade Timeline -- When to Show Up! Center to also have occasional periods of closing

We will set up and decorate the shuttle in the Parade staging area. (see Parade Staging information above for location)!

Our contingent will start out with the bulk of our marchers, including the UCSD Pep Band and folks from the UCSD Medical centers and clinics (they marched with us last year!) Next will come the UCSD shuttle WOO HOO! Folks can ride in the shuttle, blowing bubbles.

The parade is 1 1/4 mile long, and will be done no later than 2pm (we will be done by 12:30pm if everything goes well). Use sunscreen, drink lots of water and wear comfortable shoes!

- 8:30am Shuttle and VIP Vehicle with float materials arrives at site
- 9:00am Meet at spot #52 on Normal St. between Lincoln and Blaine. Decorate shuttle and VIP vehicle, see location above. (A big thank-you to Rich Laclair-Zoehrer for donating the magnets!)
- 9:00am Fire Marshall Inspects Float for Safety
- 9:45am All Non-contingent vehicles must be out of the Parade Zone
- 10:00 am UCSD Pep Band Rehearsal with marchers
- 10:00 am All Marchers should have arrived at the shuttle sign waivers!
- 11:00 am Our float should enter the Parade sometime after 11am!

Wednesday, September 20th, 9:00AM - 1:30PM Cross-Cultural Center

Q Camp began in the fall of 2002 with only 13 registrants. Proclaimed as a huge success by those attending, the event grew primarily by word of mouth in its second year. With the addition of counselors from the UCSD LGBT community who led discussions, the numbers of registrants more than doubled, with 30 participants. In 2004, the campus was canvassed by a core of counselors and volunteers, 46 people registered, and even more attended the event. In 2005, attendance grew even larger.

Queering the Color Line by Siobhan B. Somerville

Queering the Color Line transforms previous understandings of how homosexuality was "invented" as a category of identity in the United States beginning in the late nineteenth century. Analyzing a range of sources, including sexology texts, early cinema, and African American literature, Siobhan B. Somerville argues that the emerging understanding of homosexuality depended on the context of the black/white "color line," the dominant system of racial distinction during this period. This book thus critiques and revises tendencies to treat race and sexuality as unrelated categories of analysis, showing instead that race has historically been central to the cultural production of homosexuality.
