

History of Q Camp:

Q Camp began in the fall of 2002 with only 13 registrants. Proclaimed as a huge success by those attending, the event grew primarily by word of mouth in its second year. With the addition of counselors from the UCSD LGBT community who led discussions, the numbers of registrants more than doubled, with 30 participants. In 2004, the campus was canvassed by a core of counselors and volunteers, 46 people registered, and even more attended the event. For the 2005 edition of Q Camp, counselors went through extensive cotraining with UCSD's Queer Peer Support Program, and Q Fair was added as an opportunity for our entire community to connect with Q Campers during an informal resource fair.

Q Camp continues to grow, and has evolved into the quickest and easiest ways for incoming students to connect to the LGBT community.



Imagine Our Growth ...

Imagine the future of the UCSD LGBT Resource Center, and one can't help but be involved in the incredible work. The UCSD LGBT Resource Center is experiencing dramatic growth. The center has tripled its size and doubled its staff in the first three years of its existence. 

The LGBT Resource Center, one of the Campus Community Centers, occupies Building 312 of the University Center. The space was designed from the ground up with the needs of the community in mind. It includes an outdoor deck area, kitchen, library, and large common room, as well as space for office staff and reception.

The common room, adjacent to our outdoor deck, is a drop-in space to sit and read, chat with friends and colleagues, access media from our lending library, or access the Internet. It is also connected to a common kitchen with a sink, refrigerator, toaster, microwave, and coffee pot. Drop by for a quick snack, or head on over and bring your lunch.

Our library has a conference table and chairs with space to sit, read, and study. 
Mission




7) Men's Group - Tuesdays 7pm
