UCSD GROVE GALLERY PRESENTS SERIGRAPHIC ART

Silkscreen artists Chet Wooding and Will McHenry will combine their works in a show called "Screen Prints," beginning on Feb. 18, at the University of California, San Diego Grove Gallery.

The show will continue through March 1. A public reception for the artists will be held from 6-8 p.m. Friday, Feb. 21.

Wooding was born in Honolulu and currently lives in San Diego. He is a founding member of SIRIUS, an all-media artists' cooperative in San Diego that dates back to the early 1970s.

Wooding's work has appeared in the sales gallery of the La Jolla Museum of Contemporary Art and in the Fine Arts Gallery of Balboa Park. He is the creator of Alternative Ts Fashion Designs which include handpainted and silkscreened clothing art. A teacher at the University of California Crafts Center, Wooding also operates a graphic design/process camera business.

McHenry's pieces will include abstract and geometric screenprints on paper, plastic and aluminum. "Some of the colors will be subtle and other works will have bright primary colors," McHenry said.

While silkscreening is McHenry's major medium, he also enjoys working with pen and ink, and sculpting in "anything from wood to concrete."

A San Diegan, McHenry attended Santa Rosa Junior College and Sonoma State, where he studied fine arts.
