

Eric Christmas to give lecture/performance

Members of the University of California, San Diego campus-community and the general public can enjoy a holiday treat when drama professor Eric Christmas gives a free lecture/performance titled "Christmas in November: A Lighthearted Look at Holiday Entertainment Through the Centuries" at noon, November 26, in the UCSD Theatre.

The appearance by Christmas will mark the third, and final, "Adventures in Research" lecture of the fall quarter.

The series, sponsored by the Council of Provosts, the Public Information Office, and Third College will continue with four lectures planned for the winter quarter.

Christmas, one of the founders of the UC San Diego Department of Drama, is a veteran character actor with a long list of guest appearances on television series, full-length films, and performances with the Old Globe Shakespeare Festival to his credit.

The "Adventures in Research" lecture series was begun in October in an effort to better acquaint the UC San Diego staff, faculty and students, as well as members of the community, with some of the faculty and research currently underway on campus.
