

Women's Caucus First Annual 10-Kilometer Run

The UCSD Women's Caucus First Annual 10-Kilometer Run begins at 9 a.m. Saturday, June 2, in the University of California, San Diego Medical School parking lot, located at the intersection of Gilman and Myers drives.

The race is open to men and women of all ages. Applications for the 6.2-mile race are due by Wednesday, May 23, and applications can be obtained at various sporting goods stores in San Diego or from Women's Caucus members.

The entry fee is \$5 and all entrants will be given race T-shirts. Prizes will be given to the top three winners in each division, and drawings for additional prizes will be conducted at the end of the run.

The scenic route is an AAU-certified course on relatively flat terrain with one steep hill. Aid stations will be set up at the half-way point and at the finish line.

In conjunction with the race, the UCSD Women's Caucus is conducting a forum called "Women and Running" at 4:45 Tuesday, May 22, in room 111A of the Administrative Complex at UC San Diego. Nicki Hobson, vice president of the San Diego Track Club, and a panel of experienced runners will discuss running and answer questions.
