London 8th Feby 1763

I wish I could give you as good
an Account of Mrs Hall, as I can of all your
Children who are perfectly well; but
Mrs Hall has been in but a very poor
Way for these two Months past. I think
she has something of the Gout flying about
her, which has appeared three or four
times by a swelled foot, whenever that
happens her Spirits are refresh'd, and she
recovers her Stomach in some measure,
but when the swelling disappears, it
falls upon her Stomach, and she takes
little or no nourishment. If it is Gout
she has not Strength enough to throw
it from the vital Parts to the Extremities.
Having suffer'd in this manner for these
two Months, she is very much reduced,
but as the Spring is advancing it gives
me hopes of her recovery, which I should
be pleas'd to tell you.

& am heartily glad you have got your
Negroes again. Our Prints will bring
you all the Publick News. I believe
our Affairs with France & Spain are pretty
near adjusted, and that we shall in long
have the definitive Treaty signed.
