

Garymas April 29th 1861

Dear Sisters

I sent you a few lines the other day by the way of Panswaind whether this reaches it is hard to say I send this by Captain Mowry he is bound up to port Buccannon if he does not get cut off on his way he promised to make it; it may get to San Francisco before it reaches you, I have not heard any thing from Captain Isham in more than two months what he intends doing I do not have the least idea, I hope that you get your mine sense I left San Francisco but I do not know as I have not had a letter from Frodoham I penny sense I have been here, I cannot stop here much longer doing nothing I have been up and down the coast each way about 30 miles but have found nothing in the shape of Guano I hope you will not get discouraged if you do not hear from me so often as the over land route is to be taken off it will be some time for letters to get

Round, This is getting to be all
most like a whale. why I have
not had a letter from you since
I have been here whether they are
in San Francisco or on the way or have
been his side at any rate I do not
get them, you must give my love
to Sister Charlot & Eliza Henry and Edward
must write me hoping this will find
you all well it is very healthy
here but the weather is getting some
what warm as the town is hemol in
by the mountains that the sea breeze
does not have any affect in town
if I stop here much longer I shall get
to be all most a Mexican,

but it is hard for me to get in
the way and stile of their living,
Dear Sisters do let me here from you
often
