The Prefect (or person exercising the functions of that Offices) of each district will designate the filaces for ofreming the probles and give due notice of the election, in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution & Schedule.

The people are now called reprove to fame a government for themselves, and to designate such Officers as they desired to make & executo the laws. That their choice may be wisely made, and that the bovernment song anyid may secure the frem amont welfare & happiness of the people of the new State, is the sincere & earnest wish of the prosent executive, who, if the Constitution be ratified, will, with pleasure, surrender his provers to whomsevere the people
