

Nearly one quarter of UCSD undergraduates named to Fall quarter Dean's Honor List

Nearly one quarter of the undergraduates at the University of California, San Diego have been named to the Dean's Honor List for the recently completed fall quarter according to the Registrar and Admissions Office which compiles the grade reports for the campus.

In addition, nearly 30 per cent of those on the honor list received straight A grades in their class work.

The Dean's Honor List, compiled following each quarter, is made up of all undergraduate students who have made a 3.5 or better grade point average in all classes taken during the quarter. A 3.0 grade point average is equivalent to a B average.

The current honors list names 1,131 students, better than 21 per cent of the 5,348 undergraduates attending UCSD during the Fall, 1972, quarter. 327 of those on the list, better than 6 per cent of the total UCSD undergraduate student body, made a 4.0 grade point average - an A grade in every class taken during the quarter.
