

Pearson receives postdoctoral fellowship

James J. Pearson has been named one of 60 recipients of postdoctoral fellowships by the National Science Foundation. The fellowships are awarded to allow advanced study and research in science, mathematics, or engineering.

Dr. Pearson is a Junior Research Physicist in the Physics Department, School of Science and Engineering, University of California, San Diego. The award will allow him to conduct research at the Centre for Nuclear Studies, Saclay, France, for a year beginning in October 1962.

Fellowships in the program are awarded to persons who have demonstrated ability and special aptitude for advanced training in the sciences and who have recently received a doctoral degree in one of the fields of science supported by the National Science Foundation. The Fellows receive an annual stipend of \$5,000, an allowance for dependents, and a limited allowance to aid in defraying the cost of travel to the affiliated institution.

Pearson, 27, received his Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh this year. He joined the San Diego staff in July.
