

Violinist Louis Krasner will give techniques seminars

October 1, 1971

Distinguished violinist Louis Krasner will present two seminars on performance techniques of composers Alban Berg, Arnold Schoenberg, and Anton Webern at the University of California, San Diego.

Krasner, who has been personally acquainted with these composers of the Viennese School, will present the seminars on Thursday, October 14 and 28, both at 12 noon in the Art Gallery on Matthews Campus.

He was the soloist in the premier performance of the Berg Violin Concerto in 1936 and the Schoenberg Violin Concerto in 1940. Both works performed by Krasner are available on Columbia (Recording m14857

The seminars are part of a series sponsored by the UCSD Department of Music bi-weekly to assist research being done by faculty, students and visitors and are free and open to the public. The series was organized by Pauline Oliveros, Assistant Professor of Music. November seminars will feature UCSD graduate student John Mizelle-- discussing the use of lasers in music and Bruce Liebig discussing the use of computers in musical arrangements.
