I James Barclay of the parish of St. Andrew in the Island of Jamaica
aforesaid Esquire do make public and declare this my last will and Testament in
Manner and form following that is to say I give my soul to God who gave it and my Body
to the Earth from whence it Came and hope of a happy Eternity at the day of Resurrection
And as touching such Worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me with I give
and dispose of the same as followeth I Give devise and Bequeath unto my Son in
Law Thomas Halse Esquire all that Silver Plate at his present possession **He** and
also the Diamond Bracelet which he hath given me by the said Thomas Halse which
I desire may be delivered to him by the hands of my Son in Law the said Thomas Esquire
I Give and direct that the two old Chairs of Dining room with Silver with the
old Chair in the Dining room at his present possession shall be and remain
theirs for the use of the said Thomas and all the rest of my Silver Plate given devise and
Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary the wife of the said Thomas Halse her
Heirs and assigns forever I Give devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter
Katherine the sum of Eighty pounds Jamaica Money as a Complement for her Service
done at his present possession I Give devise and Bequeath unto my
Daughter Anne the sum of Fifty pounds Jamaica Money to be paid to her
when she shall be a Widow and Bequeath unto the said Anne and her
Heirs the House and the two Acres of Land situated near my old Plantation
in the said parish of St. Andrew and now is due to the said Charles Graham to hold the
same with the Rent and Profits thereof to her the said Anne and her Heirs during
the Term of her Natural life subject to the said Anne in the said House and Land to
the said Charles Graham and after her decease the said House and Land to
fall into the said Anne's full Estate her Heirs and assigns I Give devise and
Bequeath unto my Son Thomas Halse all the sum of the said Thomas Halse the
sum of Five hundred pounds Jamaica Money to be paid him out of the monies due to me
from the Estate of my late deceased Son in Law the said Thomas Halse and directing the
Estate of my late deceased Son in Law the said Thomas Halse Esquire from the said
House and Land to be sold and the Interest thereof to be paid to the said Anne and her
Heirs and assigns I Give devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary the wife of the said
Thomas Halse Esquire One Annuity for the Term of Years of the said Thomas Halse Money to
be paid her out of the said House and Land of my Estate for the said Term of Years
the Term of her Natural life I Give devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter
Elizabeth the sum of One hundred pounds Jamaica Money to be paid her at the
Age of Twenty One Year or Day of her Marriage which shall first happen and in case she
dies before that time the said Money to be paid and to fall into the Hands of my Estate
I Give devise and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary the wife of the said Thomas Halse the sum of
