

Leena Kareoja, Finnish pianist will present a recital which is open to the public.

Music by five great composers for the piano will be heard in a free, public recital in La Jolla on Sunday night, February 3.

Leena Kareoja, Finnish pianist, will present works by Hindemith, Sibelius, Chopin, Bartok, and Liszt, in Sumner Auditorium of the University of California, San Diego, at 8:00 p.m. The recital is open to the public. Admission is free.

Selections on the program are Hindemith's "Second Sonata for Piano," Sibelius's "Six Impromptus, opus 5," Chopin's "Sonata in B-Minor," Bartok's "Six Dances in Bulgarian Rhythm," and Liszt's "Etude No. 3 in D-Flat Major" and "Hungarian Rhapsody No. 8."

Miss Kareoja studied piano in her native Finland, at the State Academy of Music with Richard Hauser, and in Paris under a scholarship from the French government with Samson Francois. She has given solo performances in Finland and Austria and has appeared with various symphony orchestras, including the Finnish Radio Symphony and the Helsinki Symphony. She has made recordings for the state radio in Finland, Sweden, and Austria. She played at UCSD in 1961 and appeared with the La Jolla Civic Orchestra in November, 1962.

The concert is a part of the Sumner Chamber Music Series, sponsored by the Committee for Arts and Lectures.
