

Dr. Carl H. FitzGerald Asst. Professor of Mathematics at UCSD granted a fellowship for basic research by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation

Dr. Carl H. FitzGerald Assistant Professor of Mathematics at the University of California, San Diego, has been granted a fellowship for basic research by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation. He has been awarded the Sloan Research Fellowship together with 78 other young scientists on the faculties of 49 colleges and universities.

The new Fellows were selected on the basis of nominations from senior colleagues familiar with their capacity to perform outstanding and creative basic research. They will be supported for two years at an average rate of \$8,750 a year.

The Sloan Fellowship for Basic Research is designed to make possible advances in fundamental research by young scientists at an early stage of their careers.

Dr. FitzGerald, born March 26, 1942, joined UCSD as Assistant Professor in July 1967. He was awarded the Fellowship from among nearly 600 nominees, representing United States and Canada. Their areas of study included physics, mathematics, chemistry, neuroscience, and certain interdisciplinary fields such as geochemistry and astrophysics.

The Sloan Research Fellow does not submit a research proposal to the Foundation, but he is required to file a brief annual progress report with the Foundation. This may take the form of scientific articles published as a result of work supported by the fellowship.
