UCSD CHANCELLOR HONORED BY ALMA MATER

Robert C. Dynes, chancellor of the University of California, San Diego, has been awarded an honorary Doctor of Science degree from his alma mater, McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, for his "contributions to science and achievements as a scholar, educator, and administrator."

Dynes accepted the honorary degree, McMaster's "most significant honour," and gave an address at the university's Faculty of Science Convocation June 3.

Dynes received his master's and doctorate degrees in physics from McMaster University. He holds a bachelor's degree in mathematics and physics from the University of Western Ontario. Dynes served as senior vice chancellor for academic affairs- UCSD's top academic post prior to being inaugurated UCSD's sixth chancellor in October, 1996.
