With 30 new projects, many of which are one-time performances and events, plus a 16-night film series, a series of four academic dialogues, numerous artist talks at cultural centers and colleges, and other special programs, inSITE2000 will offer a wide array of experiences.

in(fo)SITES

There will be two information centers, called in(fo)SITES. In San Diego, the center, located downtown in the Speckles Building, 923 First Avenue at Broadway, will be open daily, except Monday, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. In Tijuana, the in(fo)SITE will be located at the Centro Cultural Tijuana (CECUT), Paseo de los Heroes at Mina SN in the Zona Rio district. It will be open daily, except Monday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Exploration Weekends

inSITE2000 has scheduled four weekends of concentrated activity that will enable the public to experience the new works being created, as they unfold. These "Exploration Weekends" will include presentations of events and performances, special artist-led talks at project sites, and various public programs, including *Conversations*, a series of informal dialogues that bring together renowned scholars and cultural critics to discuss issues relevant to the region.

Exploration Weekends, which will commence with Friday events, are scheduled for Oct. 13-15, Nov. 17-19, Jan. 19-21 and Feb. 23-25.

During the Exploration Weekends, the public has the choice of joining an organized "Expedition," led by senior SITE2000 staff members or curators, or arranging their own transportation to the various sites. One-day Expeditions, including lunch, start at \$40 (\$25 for students).
