

Guarneri Quartet to perform

March 26, 1968

The Guarneri String Quartet, one of the most popular and praised American quartets, will perform at 8:30 p.m., Friday, April 5, in Sherwood Hall, La Jolla. The program will be: Quartet in D Major, K. 575 by Mozart, Quartet in F by Ravel and Quartet in A Minor, Op. 51, No. 2 by Brahms.

Reserved seating for the concert, sponsored by the Committee for Arts and Lectures of the University of California, San Diego, is \$3.00 for the general public and \$1.00 for UCSD students.

The Quartet is composed of four outstanding young American artists, each a well-known figure in the world of music. The collaboration of these artists is a result of years of playing chamber music together at the Marlboro Music Festival in Vermont and the Casals Festival in Puerto Rico.

The New York Times wrote of their New York debut in 1965: "Good string quartets are rare in any age. But now a new quartet has emerged that promises to become of importance not only to this country but to the world as well. The group's tone is like satin. The vibratos are warm and matched. The rhythm is solid, the intonation exemplary and the sense of style masterly."

In 1966 the Quartet toured the United States and Canada, playing eight concerts in New York City alone. They have had several television appearances, including "Recital Hall," "Profile on the Arts," and "The Today Show."

Presently the Quartet, which has sold-out tours of over 100 concerts each year, is in residence at Harpur College, Binghamton, New York.
