

UC Assistant General Counsel Warren Levin named UCSD Assistant Vice Chancellor-Business and Finance

Warren S. Levin, an Assistant Counsel serving in the Office of the General Counsel for The Regents of the University of California since 1965, has been appointed Assistant Vice Chancellor - Business and Finance for the San Diego campus of the University.

The appointment, which is effective June 1, was announced by H.D. Johnson, Vice Chancellor - Business and Finance for UCSD.

During his five years with the Office of the General Counsel, which is located near the Berkeley campus of the University, Levin has served as the campus legal liaison for UCSD. In his new capacity he will assist Johnson in the conduct of the campus business and financial operation.

Levin graduated Cum Laude from the University of California, Berkeley in 1958 with an A.B. degree in economics and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. Three years later he graduated from the UC Boalt Hall School of Law receiving a Doctor of Jurisprudence degree. He was co-author and recipient of first prize for the best written appellate brief filed in the 1959/60 Moot Court Competition. He also received the West Publishing Company Award for the highest academic mark in the third year class in the field of Conflict of Laws.

Following graduation from law school, Levin served two years as a Captain in the United States Army and later with the law firm of Myers, Praetzel and Pierce in San Anselmo, California.

He is a member of the American Bar Association, the California Bar Association, B'nai Brith and Phi Kappa Sigma. He and his wife, the former Marjorie Lowitz of La Mesa, have two children, Matthew, 4, and Shana, 2.
