

Animated Filmmaker Raymond Charles Rice to lecture

Raymond Charles Rice, animation filmmaker and artist, will present a lecture at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 30, at the University of California, San Diego.

The lecture, co-sponsored by the Department of History and the Committee for Arts and Lectures, will be held in Room 2113, Building 2A, on the Muir College campus.

Rice will lecture on the techniques he uses and will show examples of his work. The program is free and open to the public.

He has shown his paintings, mosaics and sculpture in New York, Syracuse, Rochester, Buffalo, New Orleans, Denver, San Francisco, Fresno, Tulsa, etc., and various colleges since 1937. He has held one-man exhibitions in the California Palace of the Legion of Honor, the Richmond Art Center and Mendocino and Mill Valley.

He has presented his films and given lectures in many educational institutions and currently has eight of his films on a 12-month circuit in 20 theaters nationally.

Rice has taught art at Fresno State College, San Quentin Prison, College of Marin, the California College of Arts and Crafts and the Mendocino Art Center.
