

Prof. Martin Rees to deliver first annual Marlar Lecture, sponsored by CASS

Noted theoretical astrophysicist Prof. Martin Rees will deliver the first annual Marlar Lecture on "The Big Bang and the Fate of the Universe" Thursday, April 21, at the University of California, San Diego.

Rees' talk will be at 4 p.m. in Third College Lecture Hall 107 and is open to the public at no admission charge.

Rees is Plumian Professor of Astronomy and Director of the Institute of Astronomy at Cambridge University and a Fellow of the distinguished British Royal Society and Kings College, Cambridge.

He has held visiting appointments at Caltech the Institute for Advanced Study, Princeton and Harvard University. He has worked extensively on the theory of cosmic radio sources, the history of the early Universe and its structure and evolution.

The Marlar Lecture is sponsored by the Center for Astrophysics and Space Sciences at UCSD under a grant from William F. Marlar Memorial Foundation, an educational foundation assisting scholars in the space sciences.
