

Scholarships go to engineers

One thousand dollars in scholarships has been made available to two students studying engineering at the University of California, San Diego, it was announced today by Lynn C. Naibert, financial aids officer.

Acco Construction Equipment Company of El Cajon and Whittier presented scholarships to Stephen Hill and Mark B. Moore, both students in the Department of Aerospace and Mechanical Engineering Sciences. The Acco gift was matched by Regents' funds.

Gene Adams, president of Acco, and Roger Carey, San Diego branch manager, made the awards: "We are particularly pleased and proud to assist students engaged in the study of mechanical and chemical engineering. Their educational career is important to us in an industry that needs engineers for a good continuing road program," Adams said.

Hill, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Carroll Hill, of 3971 Vista Grande Drive, graduated third in a class of 1,000 students at Crawford High School. He entered UCSD in 1965 and was awarded the Mayor Dail scholarship award from the Honorary Alumni.

Hill, who has worked for the Engineering Department of the City of San Diego, is studying for his bachelor of arts degree at Revelle College. A Dean's Honor Role student, Hill lives at 1830 Reed St., San Diego.

Mark B. Moore, son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert W. Moore of Hemet, is working for a B.A. degree in Revelle College at UCSD. A graduate of Barstow High School, Moore attended school two years in Germany, where his father was stationed in the Army. He received honors at entrance to UCSD in 1965 and was also awarded a scholarship from the Honorary Alumni.

Moore, who lives on campus, specializes in the study of guidance control and hopes to obtain a master's degree in that field.
