

UCI University Chorus performs in recital

February 11, 1972

Lovers of choral music are invited to partake in a rare treat at noon, Thursday, February 17, when the University Chorus from the University of California, Irvine performs in the UCSD Recital Hall.

The Recital Hall is located in Bldg. 409 on the Matthews Campus of the University of California, San Diego. The performance is free and open to the public.

The chorus of 75 voices is under the direction of Maurice Allard, associate professor of music at the Fine Arts Village, UC Irvine.

The performance will include two works by Igor Stravinsky: "Symphony of Psalms" for mixed chorus and two pianos, and "Mass" for mixed chorus and double woodwind guintet.

Also to be performed is Johann Sebastian Bach's longest acappella motet for antiphonal choirs, "Singet Dem Herrn." An antiphonal choir is one which is broken down Into sections in which there is a responsive interplay between the sections in the performance of the choral work.

"Fanfare for Brass" by Dietrich Buxtehude and "Pater Noster" by Jacob Handl will also be performed.
