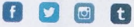

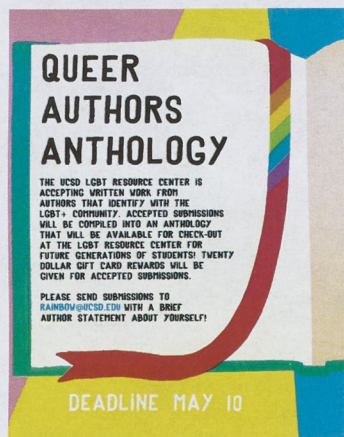

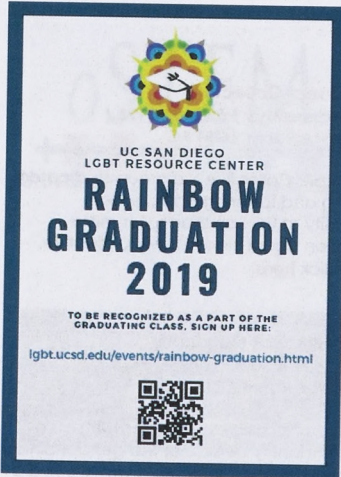
Rainbow Graduation 2019
